

# Art Supply List

## Principles of Drawing

**\*\*Highlighted materials are most important\*\***

1. Large drawing board with clips at the top of the board and handle on the side.  
**\*Tabletop or desk can work, but you will want to tape (artist or masking tape) the corners down to keep it from moving.**
  
2. Large Paper Pads (no smaller than 11 x 14): **\*any type of white/light-colored paper (not lined)**
  - a. Newsprint Pad
  - b. Sketch Pad
  - c. Drawing Pad
  - d. Bristol Paper Pad
  
3. Drawing Pencils: **\*any type of drawing utensil can work but you will not have the exact results of the demonstration. If you want to start with a few pencils, recommend 2B,5B,7B & 9B.**
  - a. **2B**, 3B, 4B, **5B**, 6B, **7B**, 8B, **9B**, 10B, 11B, 12B, F, HB
  - b. Optional: Series H2 – H9
  - c. Hard, Medium, and Soft Charcoal pencils may be required.
  - d. Other pencils may be required at a later date.
  
4. Erasers:
  - a. Pink Peril
  - b. Gum
  - c. White Magic
  - d. **Kneaded**
  
5. Straight Edge Tool: **\*a ruler or anything with a straight edge can work, but a T-square is recommended.**
  - a. **Metal T-Square (18"-24")**
  - b. Metal Yard Rule
  - c. Plastic Transparent Triangle
  
6. Miscellaneous supplies:
  - a. **Tan Masking Tape** (not the blue painters tape)
  - b. Art Supply Box, such as a small fishing tackle box
  - c. Large Brown Portfolio
  - d. Sketch Book
  - e. Lined Spiral Notebook
